Demolish or Not???

Fullerton Heritage is working with a long-time property owners in the Brookdale Heights preservation zone on whether structures on their property can be demolished as part of new development plan for the property. Fullerton Heritage's Advocacy Chair visited the property and helped determined the structures are worthy of being retained and restored. She suggested an architect be hired to prepare a development plan that retained the subject structures.

Windows, Windows, Windows

New homeowners in the Brookdale Heights preservation zone are planning to remodel their kitchen and inquired whether the existing kitchen windows could be replaced with slider-type windows. Fullerton Heritage advised the owners that slider-type windows do not keep with the 1920s-vintage residence and another window type (wood casement or double-hung) would likely be more appropriate and will likely gain the city's approval.
